

## APPENDIX B: GIS Attribute Definitions

<b>TERM</b>	<b>DEFINITION</b>
<b>Condition</b>	Condition of resource (i.e. Excellent, Good, Fair, or Poor)
<b>Cross_Stre</b>	Cross Street for resource location, where needed
<b>ID</b>	Unique number assigned to each resource
<b>Integrity</b>	Historic Integrity (i.e. High, Medium, or Low)
<b>Interp</b>	Notes whether the resource is interpreted or offers programming or interpretation for the public about the Civil War era. [Note: All historical markers and monuments, since they are readily visible to the public, were considered to be interpreted.]
<b>Known_Also</b>	Additional site names, where appropriate
<b>Multi_St_N</b>	Address ranges, where appropriate
<b>Notes</b>	Additional information, where available
<b>NR_Listed_</b>	Notes whether the resource is listed in the National Register or is a National Historic Landmark.
<b>Present_</b>	Indicates whether the resource is still present or whether it been demolished or otherwise removed.
<b>Related_Th</b>	Related Historic Theme. (i.e. Abolition/URR, Architecture, Commemoration, Industry/Manufacturing, Medicine, Military, Minority Experience, Politics, or Transportation) Primary theme is listed first.
<b>Resource_T</b>	Resource Type. (i.e. Building, Cemetery, Collection, Grounds, Marker, Monument, or Mural) Primary type is listed first.
<b>Site_Name</b>	Historic name of resource
<b>Street_Nam</b>	Current street name where the resource is located. Previous street names, where street names have changed, are given in notes section.
<b>Street_Num</b>	Building address number
<b>Web_Site</b>	Web site address, where available
